




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In Nomine Diaboli MoniKa Küble Henry Gerlach

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IN NOMINE DIABOLI a historical crime novel

October 1414. Thousands stream into Constance to take part in the council: the king and pope, cardinals, bishops, artisans, craftsmen, jugglers (impostors) and prostitutes. At the same time an invisible horror enters the city: a series of unexplained brutal murders overshadow the first months of the church council. One man is found hung in a cellar, another is poisoned and a woman threw herself from the city wall. The town magistrate stands before a puzzle; the citizens believe the devil is at work, since the three deaths appear to have nothing in common.

Cunrat Wolgemut, a Swabian baker, also finds himself in the city looking to make a livelihood. Cunrat is sceptical about his friend's sudden death and with the help of Giovanni Rossi, a Venetian college and Poggio Bracciolini, a Florentine humanist, he begins to inquire into the murder. The three soon find themselves sucked into a whirlpool of events, which shake the very foundations of the council. When they finally discover who the cold-blooded murderer/assassin is, it is almost too late
